1. To further strengthen and intensify the mechanisms on Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) in the new normal of in-person classes and to bolster resiliency to natural and human induced hazards, DepEd SOCCSKSARGEN Regional Office through the ESSD-DRRM Section will be having the 3rd Quarter Regional DRRM Meeting on **September 28, 2022 8:00 a.m.** at Koronadal City (Final venue will be announced later).
2. For a more comprehensive and improved DRRM in basic education, it is nothing but imperative to equitably uphold the protection, safety and resiliency of PWD's, Indigenous People, sickly or with illness and other vulnerable groups in education sector, hence a contest will be held on the same date, dubbed as **“Sana All Not Vulnerable” Essay Writing and Draw and Tell Poster Making Contest**
3. This contest aims to promote DRRM advocacy for the less privileged and vulnerable and for their full and equal enjoyment of all their rights, fundamental freedom and respect for their inherent dignity, protection and resiliency in times of disasters
4. There shall be only one participant/contestant per schools division. The Division DRRM Coordinator shall screen and choose their respective participant and register on <https://bit.ly/sanaallregistration> not later than September 26, 2022.
5. “Sana All Not Vulnerable Essay Writing Contest” will be judged based on the following Criteria:

Substance and Content-	40%
Relevance to the Theme	30%
Originality	15%
Mastery of English Language	15%



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6. The Draw and Tell Poster making contest have the following criteria

Creativity	30%
Originality	30%
Theme Communication*	40%
TOTAL	100%

7. Prizes for both of the contests are:

1 st Place	4,000.00
2 nd Place	3,500.00
3 rd Place	2,500.00
Entries from 4 th to 8 th (Consolation prize)	700 each

8. Attached herein are the Contest guidelines and criteria for reference and guidance.

9. The following expenses shall be chargeable to 2022 DRRM Comprehensive Release Fund (CRF) Program Support Fund (PSF) and ESSD-DRRM Local Funds

**DEPED XII DRRM “SANA ALL NOT VULNERABLE” ESSAY WRITING AND
DRAW AND TELL POSTER MAKING CONTEST MECHANICS/GUIDELINES
AND CRITERIA**

Objectives:

1. Reinforce knowledge, awareness-raising and capacity of participants and DRRM implementers in advocating the protection, safety, and resiliency of people with special or specific needs in times of Disaster
2. Stimulate creativity of youth in SOCCSKSARGEN in expressing their thoughts and ideas in DRRM advocacy for vulnerable groups through Essay Writing and Draw and Tell Poster Making Contest
3. Share experience-based learning about values for DRRM, CCAM, and Peace Building resilience programs and projects; particularly focused on building capacities at all levels and empowering vulnerable and marginalized youth within DepEd XII
4. Engage in joint discussion, learning, and collaboration about what works well-good practices, lessons, and insights relevant to participants, including common barriers to progress and how it may be possible to overcome them.
5. Mobilize and Strengthen Support of DepEd Top Management, LGU's, Policy Makers, Government and Non-Government Organizations and stakeholders for initiatives and advocacies that will uphold the protection, safety and resiliency of vulnerable groups in DepEd XII

I. CONTEST GUIDELINES for DRAW-AND-TELL CONTEST

1. This is a region-level contest and there shall only be **one participant/contestant per Schools Division**
2. Division DRRM Coordinator shall screen and choose their respective participant
3. Participants must be currently enrolled Grade 4, Grade 5 or Grade 6 pupil of DepEd SOX
4. Division DRRM Coordinator shall register their participant on <https://bit.ly/sanaallregistration>
5. Each participant is entitled to only **ONE (1)** coach or chaperone.
6. Posters must incorporate creative and original artwork and ideas.



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7. Posters must deliver a clear and positive message about being proactive in Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM). Gloomy themes and art displaying adverse scenarios (such as death, people suffering and dying, etc.) are not considered positive messages. The poster must not contain depiction that are offensive, explicit, profane, lewd, satanic, subversive or discriminatory.
8. Participants shall bring their own drawing materials based on their preference such as pencil, watercolor, pen, ink, crayon, chalk, markers, pastel etc., and **20" x 30" illustration board** to be used.
9. Keep in mind that winning posters may be reproduced or reprinted, so clear artwork and easy to read messages are encouraged.
10. Participants must refrain from writing their name or other identifying information on the front of the poster. The participants' name or other identifying information may be written at the back of their poster. The same shall be done for poster contest entry numbers.
11. Draw time is three (3) hours and Tell (presentation) is 5-10 minutes only. The standard language to be used on telling is either **English or Filipino**.
12. The name of the participant or school being represented should not appear in any part of the work. Participants will be given Reference Number which will be used to identify the entries.
13. The organizers shall display a wall or digital clock so that the participants are guided on the time limitations. The organizers should also call the remaining contest time: last one hour, last thirty minutes, last fifteen minutes, last five minutes, and last minute.
14. Failure to comply with the guidelines could result in a disqualification of the entry.
15. Posters will be judged on the following criteria:

Creativity	30%
Originality	30%
Theme Communication*	40%
TOTAL	100%

***Theme Communication:** how well the theme is expressed in the artwork and the supporting statement

16. After the adjudication and tabulation of results, the Panel of Judges shall announce and award the winners of the contest. The decision of the Panel of Judges is FINAL.



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17. Winners will receive the following prizes:

1 st Place	4,000.00
2 nd Place	3,500.00
3 rd Place	2,500.00
Entries from 4 th to 8 th (Consolation prize)	700 each

18. All participants will be given a certificate.

II. CONTEST GUIDELINES for ESSAY-WRITING CONTEST

1. This is a region-level contest and there shall be only one participant/contestant per Schools Division
2. Participant must be currently enrolled Grade 8, Grade 9 or Grade 10 student of DepEd SOX
3. Division DRRM Coordinator shall register their participant on <https://bit.ly/sanaallregistration>
4. Each participant is entitled to only ONE (1) coach or chaperone Laptops will be used during the contest. Participants may bring their own laptops or use a laptop provided by the school being represented. Internet access to the laptop should be turned off throughout the duration of the contest. Designated personnel will be monitoring the contestants during the work period.
5. After the announcement of the central theme of the contest, the participants are given **five (5) minutes** to consult with the coaches. After that, the participants are given **two (2) hours** to work on their entries. No more coach or chaperone interference is allowed during this period.
6. The essay must follow the specified set-up below:
 - Paper Size : A4
 - Font Style : Arial
 - Font Size : 12
 - Alignment : Justified
 - Margin : 1 inch on all sides
 - Spacing: Double space
7. The essay must be written in English. **Maximum** word count is **2,000** while **Minimum** word count is **750**.
8. The name of the participants or school being represented should not appear in any part of the work. Participants will be given Reference Number which will be used to identify the entries.
9. The organizers shall display a wall or digital clock so that participants are guided on the time limitations. The organizers should also announce the



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following during the contest time: last one hour, last thirty minutes, last fifteen minutes, last five minutes, and last minute.

10. All entries should be saved using **Reference Number** as file name. After the contest period, entries will be submitted through thumb drives provided by the organizers.
11. Entries will be judged on the following criteria:

Substance and Content	40%
Relevance to the Theme	30%
Originality	15%
Mastery of the English Language	15%
TOTAL	100%

12. After the adjudication and tabulation of results, the Panel of Judges shall announce and award the winners of the contest. The decision of the Panel of Judges shall is **FINAL and irrevocable**.

13. Winners will receive the following prizes:

1 st Place	4,000.00
2 nd Place	3,500.00
3 rd Place	2,500.00
Entries from 4 th to 8 th (Consolation prize)	700 each

14. All participants will be given a certificate.



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
