REITERATION OF THE GUIDELINES ON TEACHING LOADS, CLASS PROGRAM AND CLASS SIZE FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2023-2024

- 1. This office reiterates the following guidelines that shall be considered in the preparation of teaching loads, class program and organization of classes:
 - a. **DM-OUHROD-2023-1116** stipulates that all Public Elementary, Junior High, and Senior High Schools are enjoined to observe the following:
 - i. exercise a fair and equitable distribution of teaching workload to maximize the **six hours** of actual classroom teaching;
 - ii. protect the two (2) hours of all teaching personnel to cover for work incidental to teaching duties; and
 - iii. accord priority to assigning actual classroom teaching over ancillary, administrative, and nonteaching tasks to the teaching personnel.
 - b. **DECS Order No. 39, s. 1990** states that all Master Teachers I and II be given full teaching loads, except those with special projects or research, in which case a minimum of 4 teaching loads be given. As indicated in the duties and responsibilities of Master Teachers, they shall conduct in-depth studies or action research on teaching-learning innovations.
 - DepEd Order No. 021, s. 2019
 - i. The time allotment for elementary level is shown in Table 1.

Note:

- 1. Special Curricular Programs shall also be offered twice a week at forty minutes per session.
- 2. Clubs should meet for 40 minutes twice a month as well.
- 3. Schools are encouraged to apportion time for arrival and assemble, library work, lunch and recess, remediation, and other related tasks.
 - ii. The time allotment of eight learning areas for Junior High School is shown in Table 2.

Note: Independent or Cooperative learning is given two hours per week. Grade 10 learners have Citizenship Training Program for an hour per week.

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- iii. Independent or cooperative learning will be used for individual work, research/review/library time under the supervision of the teacher concerned.
- iv. For the time allotment for Senior High School, refer to pages 61-81 of DepEd Order No. 021, s. 2019.
- d. **DepEd Order 41, s. 2012**. The class size shall range from a minimum of 15 pupils/students to a maximum of 60 pupils/students per class for Grade 5 to high school. The enhanced planning parameters is shown in Table 3.

- i. Special curricular programs/disciplines with existing approval from the National or Regional office shall only be offered if the required minimum number of learners is met.
- 2. To ensure compliance with this memorandum, schoolheads are advised to submit Class and Teacher's Program of Teachers I-III, Master Teachers, Head Teachers, Teachers-In-Charge with teaching loads, and locally paid teachers for the School Year 2023-2024 to the office of the CID on or before **September 29, 2023**. A Self-Certification signed by the schoolhead shall be attached to ensure that

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enhanced planning parameters were strictly followed. Personnel concerned are advised to refer to the Enclosure to this Division Memorandum for the template.

- 3. Class and Teachers' Programs must be consistent with the data reflected in the School Form 4 (SF4) or Monthly Learners' Movement and Attendance and School Form 7 (SF 7) or School Assignment List and Basic Profile.
- 4. These are the signatories for the teacher's and class program in compliance to RA 11032 or Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery Act of 2018.
